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Mrs Nirmala Sitharaman; Hon'ble Minister of Defence, Government of India, Mrs Ketaki Sood, President, Board of Trustees, Modern Schools; Col Vijay Chadda, Chairman, Managing Committee, Modern School Barakhamba Road; Members of the Board of Trustees, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen.

It was 98 years ago, in 1920, as a young 26-year-old, that Lalaji, dreamt of an institution that would synchronize modern education and Indian ethos. And, thus, was born the Modern School. Mrs Nirmala Sitharaman is the Hon'ble Minister of Defence; Government of India since 3rd September 2017.

Born in Madurai, Raksha Mantri, Mrs Nirmala Sitharaman did her Post Graduation in Economics from the JNU and joined the Bhartiya Janata Party in the year 2008 and served as the spokesperson for the party. In 2014, she was unanimously elected to the Rajya Sabha from Andhra Pradesh and then in May 2016, from Karnataka. The Prime Minister Narendra Modi chose madam Nirmala Sitharaman to be a part of his cabinet in 2014 and was entrusted the post of the Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Commerce and Industry as well as the Minister of State for Finance and Corporate Affairs. Madam Sitharaman holds the distinction of being the first full-time Defence Minister of India and the second woman, after Mrs Indira Gandhi, to hold the Defence Minister's portfolio which she took over in the year 2017. She is the second woman to be a part of the Cabinet Committee on Security (CSS).

Madam Sitharaman has had an eclectic profile. Prior to her venture in politics, Madam served as Senior Manager (R&D) for Price Waterhouse Coopers and briefly at the BBC World Service. She has also served as a member of the National Commission for Women.

Madam, we are indeed honoured to have you amongst us this evening. On behalf of the entire Modern School fraternity, we once again welcome you Madam! We would also like to extend a hearty welcome to her spouse, Dr Parakala Prabhakar. Madam and Sir, it's a pleasure to have you with us this evening.

Ladies and Gentlemen, Modern School Barakhamba Road has grown in leaps and bounds under the able mentorship of our ex-President Mr Ashok Pratap Singh and continues to steer to greater heights under the stewardship of Mrs Ketaki Sood, President, Board of Trustees, Modern Schools. 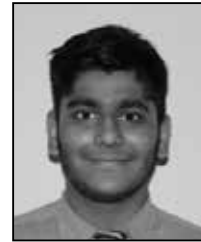

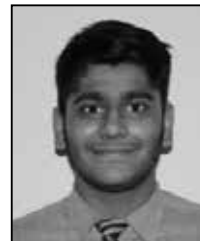

1. INITIATIVES

Academics:

The concept of 'Apply It Now' has been introduced in school to promote experiential learning. The students are encouraged to write about the real life applications of the theories, principles, procedure, thoughts and ideas taught in the class room. Their feed back in the 'Reflection Sheet' not only mentions the concepts learnt by them but also refers to the concepts which remain unclear to them after the chapter has been taught.

To help students improve their performance in academics, the Super Brain Yogah as recently been introduced in our school for the students of all the classes. It is believed to sharpen the brain for improved concentration. The team of expert-trainers teaches the Super Brain Yoga during the first five minutes of the D.E.A.R. Class Teachers' Periods daily.

Sports

The Badminton Courts have been renovated and synthetic courts are now available for training of the students.

Co-curricular Activities

The students of the school, across classes, were earlier split into 15 'Houses' for their rounded development throughout schooling. For the sake of convenience of conducting the Inter-House competitions, with an 'even' number of Houses, the 'Abdul Kalam House' was added as the 16th House from the Academic Year 2018-2019.

Upgradation of Infrastructural Facilities

Washrooms including those of the Sir Sobha Singh Block, Main Building and the Sir Shankar Lal Hall have been renovated.

Upgradation of Safety and Security

Female guards have been deputed in the school buses since November 2017. These guards accompany students to and fro school, on the

school bus routes. During the working hours of the school, they are deputed at their assigned places in the school premises, to take care of the students, especially girl-students.

Additional CCTV Cameras have been installed, including the secluded locations on the school premises, to monitor the entire campus more closely.

A School Safety Hub Committee has been formed and made functional in school. The Committee undertakes a Monthly Safety Walk of the entire school premises to assess the security of the check points, detect flaws in the safety measures and then work towards its timely rectification in an effort to make the campus safe for the students.

Upgradation of the Financial Processes

The financial processes of the School have been modernized and the option of 'Online' payment of the school fees, using the school's website, has been made available to the parents from the latter half of the year 2017.

The School has also introduced the facility of 'Paytm App' and the parents can now pay the school fee of their wards through this App and collect Fee Receipts Online.

2. AWARDS TO THE PRINCIPAL

Principal, Dr Vijay Datta, received the 'Principal of the Year' Award presented by the Indo-British Business Forum, London at the London Parliament in June this year. This award is given in recognition of meritorious service in the field of education.

3. AWARDS TO SCHOOL/TEACHERS

Our School has been accredited with the International School Award (2018-2021), for the fourth time in succession, by the British Council, for conducting its activities at par with international standards.

Our School has been bestowed the 'National Education Excellence

Award 2018' by the Career Connect Magazine for being the 'Best School of India for Overall Development of Students'.

The School was a recipient of the 'Ayush Friendly School of the Year Award' for promoting Yoga by the Yoga and Naturopathy Secretariat in March 2018.

Our School has been awarded for the "School Leadership & Inspirational Values" in the 'Day-cum-Boarding School Category' by the Jury in the 'The North School Merit Awards Survey' conducted by Education Today Co. in July 2018.

Mr F.B. Ahmed, Senior Teacher of the Department of English, has been appointed the Honorary Chancellor of the Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad (a Central University by Act of Parliament) on 17th May 2018 for a period of three years.

Under the leadership and initiative of our teacher, Ms Neha Jindal, our students performed exceptionally well in SOF NSO exams during 2017-18. She has therefore been awarded the 'Best District Teacher for SOF National Science Olympiad (2017-2018)' by the Academic Council of Science Olympiad Foundation. The award carries a citation, a trophy with a cash prize of Rs.1,000/-.

4. ACADEMICS & EXAMINATION

Academics

12 students from the 'Batch of 2017' were awarded the Certificate of Merit by the C.B.S.E. for being within the 'top 0.1%' (subject wise) in the All India Senior School Certificate Examinations held in March 2017. 4 students bestowed with certificates for English (Core) are – Sukanya Viswanathan; Jaidev Prasada, Medhavi Dhawan; Arjun Chhabra, Psychology- Aedha Rawal; Anoushka Amar; Sadhika Lamba, for Painting- Aarushi Garg; Ragini Jyoti Jain, for Chemistry - Divij Mishra and Vasu Jain and for Biotechnology - Jay Gohri.

Similarly, 78 students (presently in Class S7) were awarded the Merit Certificates by the C.B.S.E. for obtaining 'Grade A1' in all the five subjects

in the All India Secondary School Certificate Examination held in March 2017.

Zaina Sharma (then in Class S3) was ranked among the top 20 students, out of over 1000 students of Delhi/NCR, in the internationally recognized German examination, FIT in Deutsch-1, conducted by the Goethe Institut in July 2017. She was awarded a certificate and a gift voucher for a free of cost week long German learners' camp held in the summer 2018.

Vidyamandir Classes, Safdarjung Enclave, New Delhi offers a 100% scholarship to meritorious students for the 'One-year IIT JEE Programme'. Shashank Ramesh (then in Class S6) was selected for the same.

Anannya Mathur (then in S6) qualified the Regional Mathematical Olympiad and appeared in the prestigious Indian National Mathematical Olympiad 2018 conducted by the National Board for Higher Mathematics and Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education, Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Mumbai, in January 2018. She was amongst the 36 selected students from the Delhi-NCR Region and, belonged to the larger group of top rankers from 27 regions in India who qualified the RMO and were entitled to appear in the INMO.

Zaina Sharma (Class S4) qualified the National Round of the International German Olympiad conducted by the Indo German Teachers' Association in April 2018, after clearing the A2 Level during the Regional Round of the Olympiad in January 2018.

Chetna Bhagat (Batch of 2018) secured the 4th Zonal Rank out of 34,000 students from 1300 schools across India in the CS Olympiad (2017-2018) conducted by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India recently. She received a certificate with a cash award of Rs.5,000/-.

Rishabh Jain, Modernite of the Batch of 2014, got admission into I.I.M., Ahmedabad this year, for a Post Graduate Programme in Management.

The Academic session 2018-2019 commenced from 26th March 2018 for the students of Classes S5 and S7, while it began from 2nd April 2018 for the students of Classes from S2 to S4 and. The students of the

Class S1 joined school on 4th April 2018 and those of the Class S6 on 9th April 2018.

The Principal, in consultation with the Headmistress, Senior School, decided to have the teachers conduct Special Classes for Class 12 students from 14 May to 25 May 2018 during the summer vacation. These classes not only helped the students to cover substantial portion of their course of the Board examination well in advance, but also cleared their doubts at individual level. Ms Vandana Dhawan, Ms Deepa Kataria, Ms Harpreet Kaur, Ms Jyotsna Srivastava, Ms Sonika Jain, Ms Anuradha Bahl, Ms Sapna Bhargava, Mr Manoj Kumar, Ms Richa Bhatia, Ms Roma Kumar, Ms Cimeran Kher, Ms Beeba Sobti, Ms Hema Anand, Ms Deepa Kapoor, Ms Divya Sahdev, Ms Meera Malhotra, Ms Puja Kapoor, Ms Pooja Bahl and Ms Garima Tomar organized these special classes in their subjects.

To bring the newly admitted Class S6 students at par with the other students, 'Up-to-Speed' classes (which have been recently started) were held by some of our Senior School teachers from 25th to 29th June 2018. The teachers who held these classes were – Ms Jaya Khurana, Ms Anuradha Bahl, Mr Sanatan Roy, Ms Sonika Jain, Ms Meera Malhotra, Ms Sunila Kalra, Ms Sapna Bhargava, Mr Gautam Sarkar, Ms Kirtika Saxena, Ms Pooja Bahl and Ms Garima Tomar.

Examination

347 students of Class 10th appeared in The All India Secondary School Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education held in March 2018.

Aryan Arora topped the School in Class 10 Board examination with 97.2% marks while Arjun Khanchandani and Aaryan Arora both secured the 2nd Rank by obtaining 96.8% marks. There was a tie among Devina Aggarwal, Janvi Bhatia and Navya Kapur for 3rd Rank with 96.6% marks.

7 students obtained a perfect score of 100 marks in one of the subjects in Class 10 exams. Avik Chaudhery and Gautam Goel scored 100 marks in Mathematics, Aaryan Arora and Aman Maheshwari secured full 100

marks in Science, Smayaan Marwah in FIT while Devina Aggarwal and Arjjan Walia were recipients of this prestigious score in Social Science.

397 students appeared in The All India Senior School Certificate Examination of Central Board of Secondary Education held in March/April 2018.

Tushti Kapoor topped the School and stood First in the Humanities stream with 98.2% marks followed by Khushi Jain with a score of 97.2%. Gunagya Singh Mamak topped the Science stream with 98.0% marks and Shubhang Gopal and Aryaman Jain followed him with 97.0%. Chetna Bhagat was the highest scorer in the Commerce stream with 97.6% marks, followed closely by Rahul Marwaha with 96.8% marks.

21 students obtained a perfect score of 100 marks in various subjects in Class 12 exams. The students are Tushti Kapoor, Khushboo Dev and Seerat Kaur Alagh in Political Science; Saumya Jain in Economics; Peeya Bhatia, Ayushi Kapoor, Ritika, Shriya Aggarwal, Tushti Kapoor and Namya Mangalani in Psychology; Shubhang Gopal, Aryaman Jain, Gunagya Singh Mamak, Pranay Jain and Rahul Marwah in Mathematics; Gunagya Singh Mamak in Chemistry; Sonia Arora in Bio-technology; Chetna Bhagat and Vanshika Pant in Business Studies; and Ayushi Kapoor and Tushti Kapoor in Legal Studies.

The results, of our students of Class 10 and 12 in the Examinations held by the Central Board of Secondary Education in March & April 2018, were duly analyzed by the Principal and were discussed with the teachers in detail during the Staff Meeting held on 30th June 2018. He appreciated the hard work and advised teachers to be vigilant throughout the year to monitor their students' performance scholastically and co-scholastically. The Principal suggested ways of effective classroom teaching and motivated them to use innovative teaching techniques like the Flipped Classroom Teaching, Mind Maps and Smart Class.

The Science teachers were also invited to judge projects/innovations of the participants/students of the government schools from all over India, for the National Bal Shree Awards at the National Level Science competition conducted by the National Bal Bhavan, New Delhi by the Department of Educational Research, N.C.E.R.T. in association with the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India.

7. CLUBS'/SOCIETIES'/DEPARTMENTS' REPORT

ASTRONOMY CLUB



On 16th October 2017, the Club conducted a session on diverse solar phenomena like Solar Prominence, Solar Arcs and different layers of the Sun. The student-members observed the Sun using a telescope and, observed the Sun's movement with the help of Gnomon stick. In another session at the Jantar Mantar, the 'Module 2' members were briefed about the history behind the construction of the Jantar Manar and the ways to use its astronomical instruments.

A group of 5 budding astronomers and their teacher in-charge attended the 'Project Paridhi' and observed Winter Solstice at the Jantar Mantar on 21st December 2017.

On 29th January 2018, the Astronomy Club conducted a 'Rocket Science Level-I' session to teach the basics of rocketry constructions & launching of hydro rockets to the students of Module-1. On the same day, a session on tracking astronomical objects, basics of barn door tracker and its construction was taught to the students of Module-2.

The Club celebrated the 'Astronomy Day' on 8th February 2018, as a culmination of year-long activities undertaken by them. The members of the Astronomy Club presented a cultural programme through song, dance and the play 'The State versus Galileo Galilei' in the Junior Assembly and also put up an exhibition on the theme 'Astronomy through the Ages'. The exhibition showcased some important topics in Astronomy through games like 'Craters on the Moon' and 'Advanced Rocketry', displayed various working models and launched the hydro-rockets.

85 student-members of the Astronomy Club of Middle School, escorted by their teachers, attended an Overnight Observation Camp at Astroport, Sariska on 24th and 25th March 2018.

The Astronomy Club organized its first session of the academic year 2018-19 on 7th May 2018, on the topics 'Comet Making' and 'Rocket Launching' for the students of Module-1 and Module-2 respectively.

Our students from Classes S4 and S5, Samarth Khanna, Amal Jain, Sidhant Ahuja and Harshvardhan Mangla, participated in 'Mission

Discovery', an event organized by Young Edsplorer with International Space School Education Centre at Mayo School, Ajmer, together with 30 students from schools across the country and abroad.

12 students from Classes S2, S3, S4, S5 and S6 attended the Astronaut Training Programme organized by the Canadian Research Centre in our School from 14th to 25th May 2018. Students were taught 'Designing of India's Human Habitat for Mars'. They also learnt about rockets, India's Mars Mission etc.

A Virtual Reality Workshop was conducted for our students by Matt Harasymczuk, Astronaut Trainer, Aerospace Engineer and Researcher with the European Space Agency Dr Agata who focuses on space habitats on Mars 1 mission, during the summer vacation. The topics covered were (a) Apollo 11 – NASA Mission to Moon (b) Everest Expedition (c) Drone Flying (d) Google Art and Design. 23 students of Classes S2 to S5 attended the same.

The Club facilitated Astronomy Sessions for its student members of Module-I and Module-II on the topics 'Hunting of Stars through Grid' and 'Spectroscopy' respectively on 28th July 2018. These hands-on sessions were conducted by the teachers from the Space Technology and Education Pvt. Ltd.

The Club held its 3rd Session (2018-2019) on 25th August 2018 for the Module-I students on 'Astrophotography Level 1: An Introduction to DSLR Camera' and Module-II students on 'Introduction to Techniques of Image Processing and Stacking'

BITS 'N' BYTES CLUB

The Club held its Annual Intra-School Tech Symposium - 'Intra ACCESS 2017' on 22nd and 23rd November 2017. Around 150 students of Classes S1 to S6 participated in various competitions ranging from Quizzing, Webpage Designing, 3-D Modelling, Digital Imaging, Programming to Audio Visual Editing, using their imagination and creativity. The second day witnessed a surprise Gaming Session.

The Club organized its 29th Edition of the Annual Computer Symposium – ‘ACCESS 2017’ on 22nd and 23rd December 2017. It witnessed zealous participation of over 2000 students from 70 schools across the country. The two-day extravaganza allowed the participants to showcase their talent in numerous fields related to technology. Twenty-four events were hosted which included a software display where the participants had to build and present an original software. The two days of challenging competition, nerve wrecking quizzing and astounding feats of knowledge proved that ACCESS 2017 was not just a symposium but a festival of skill, paving a path to the future.

More than 100 students of Classes S1 to S6 participated in various competitions including Quizzes and competitions based on programming, Webpage Designing, Audio-Video Editing, 3D Modelling, Poster Making etc. The students also learnt to work on softwares such as Java, C++ for Programming and Photoshop for Poster Making. Prizes were given away to the deserving students.

The ‘**Indian Public Schools’ Conference IT FEST 2018**’ was hosted by our school on 29th and 30th April 2018. Over 100 participants from 17 prestigious schools across India participated in the fest which included events such as Programming, Hardware and Networking, Web Designing, Digital Imaging, Audio-Video Editing, Presentation and Quiz. The teachers of the Computer Department conducted workshops on 'Web Designing' and 'Programming' for students from Classes S1 to S7 from 14th to 31st May 2018 in school. More than 25 students attended these workshops and learnt to make websites by using HTML, CSS, Bootstrap Framework. They were also taught Programming in C++ Language using Turbo C. Some students made basic text webpage while others made complete website. In Programming, students made Moving Ball Game, using the concepts of basic programming.

Google CS First is a students' initiative to teach fellow students the basics of Game Designing with Scratch, a software developed by MIT. Harsh Gupta(S7), Abhigyan Singh (S7), Arjun Harbhajanka (S7), Aditya Shankar Agarwal (S7), Nirbhay Kwatra (S7), Aditya Sarkar (S7) and Smayan Marwaha (S6) together organized the workshop from 30th July 2018 to 3rd August 2018, which was attended by over 200 students of Classes from S1 to S4. The basic of games such as Flappy Birds and Temple Run were explained through video lessons and hands on experience. The students were given E-Certificates from Google and they received online badges on Scratch on completion of the project.

COUNSELLING DEPARTMENT/WELLNESS CENTRE

a) Career Counselling:

Officials from various foreign universities namely NUS, Full Sail University, IE Spain, Duke, Richmond, Ritsumeikan University; Japan, City University of Hong Kong, University of Navarra Spain, Arizona State, SUNY, Albany and University of Michigan, visited our school during the months of January and February 2018.

Tokyo International University and City University of Hong Kong have agreed to provide full scholarships and full tuition scholarships to the two nominated students of our school every year. The offer would be conditional.

On 4th April 2018, a Counselling Session was held by our School Counsellors for the parents of the students with 'Special Education Needs'. They were guided about the subject choices available to their special wards and how to choose subjects appropriate to their ward's academic ability.

A workshop for the ACT was held for the students on 25th July 2018 and our School's Counsellors also held career counselling sessions for the students.

During the months of April, May, July and August 2018, officials of Indian as well as various foreign universities visited our school and briefed the students of our Senior School about their universities and admission process. These included the John Hopkins University USA, University of Canada, University of Toronto, Canada and New York University Abu Dhabi, Ecole Hoteliere de Lausanne, Nanyang Technological University Singapore, University of British Columbia, Canada, Trinity College, Dublin Ireland, a group of eight renowned universities of USA, Hong Kong University of Science and Technology Hong Kong.

Officials of four Ivy League Universities of the USA, Columbia; Princeton; Penn and Cornell, visited our school on 25th September 2018. Their session was attended by the students of Class S7.

On 8th October 2018, an Interactive Session was organized for our Science Stream students of the Classes S6 and S7. The Modernites of the Batch of 2018, who have got admission into prestigious colleges like the Indian Institute of Technology; Delhi, Delhi Technical University; Delhi, Maulana Azad Medical College, Delhi, guided them about the various career options available in Science stream and gave them tips on how to study and crack the entrance examinations for admission into the top engineering and medical colleges in India.

b) Wellness Centre

On 30th November 2017, our school hosted the inaugural ceremony of the Sensitization Programme on 'Child Abuse and Violence: Inter-Personal & Digital World' conducted by the Delhi State Legal Services Authority. Justice Geeta Mittal, acting Chief Justice of the Delhi High Court and the Chairperson of the Delhi State Legal Services, was the Guest of Honour. The speakers sensitized and educated students through an interactive presentation about the laws on bullying, eve-teasing, stalking, physical dating; violence, consensual sex, cybercrimes etc. They also shared psychological & emotional distress caused to the victims as a consequence of undergoing these crimes. Mr Pawan Duggal, Cyber Lawyer, apprised them about the legal consequences of committing cyber-crimes. The students were advised to be cautious even when they are not the victims but the witnesses. The session was informative as it not only threw light on their rights and recourses under law but also reminded them of their duties.

Students with 'Special Education Needs' were encouraged to participate in various inter-school competition organized by other schools. Tamish Walia, Shreshth Sahani and Viraj Jain participated in different events in various schools during the month of November 2017.

Many indoor games have been added to help students with 'Special Education Needs' to enhance their attention and concentration to be able to improve their academic performance e.g. improving spellings in English language.

Sex education is a broad programme that aims to build a strong foundation for lifelong sexual health by acquiring information and attitudes, beliefs and value about one's identity, relationships and intimacy. Sexual health is considered to be a state of physical, emotional, mental and social well-being in relation to sexuality and not merely absence of disease. With a view to develop emotionally stable children and adolescents, who feel sufficiently secure and adequate to make decisions regarding their conduct without being carried away by their emotions, from November 2017 to January 2018, our Counsellor, during her Life Skill classes, taught 'Sex Education' in detail to the students of Class S3. She also taught them how to deal with strangers, whom to approach and to be aware of their rights in case of circumstances such as stalking, molestation, rape etc.

Our school organized a special Orientation Programme for the parents of Class S1 students on 28th March 2018. The Principal and Headmistress, Middle School addressed the parents. A talk on 'Cyber Security' was delivered by Mr Pavan Duggal, eminent Advocate specializing in Cyber & E-Commerce Law. Dr Kashyapi Awasthi, Assistant Professor, National Centre for School Leadership addressed the gathering on 'Parents as Educators' and Ms Rinku Dhugga, an IAS Officer, addressed the gathering on the topic 'Parenting the Millennial'. A western musical performance by the students at the end, made the programme joyful. Our School also held a Special Assembly on 4th April 2018, to welcome the students of Class S1 to the Senior School.

During the Life Skills Activity periods for Classes S2 and S3, the Counsellor weekly conducts Situation Reaction Test (SRT) to assess the behavioural tendencies of students to a certain situation and evaluates the effectiveness of possible responses. SRT reflects the aspirant's power of understanding, practical ability, problem solving skills, initiative, temperament, imagination, resoluteness, decision making, social behaviour, consistency, stability under stress in varying situations.

COMMERCE AND ECONOMICS SOCIETY

To arouse interest of students in various aspects of business and to identify

and hone their hidden potential, the Society organized various sessions for students of Classes S6 & S7 on varied topics such as Business Case Study Solving, Product Development, Mock Stock, Group Discussion, Marketing, Sales Pitch, Ad Acting Session and Research Project Intra.

On 7th February 2018, the Economics researchers, professors & lecturers of the York University, United Kingdom, conducted an interactive session for the students of Class S6. They conducted a lecture on the history of the 'Euro', its inception, initial policies for implementation and response, which is the mode of currency in 19 of the constituent 28 countries of the European Union. They also talked about the condition of the Euro during the aftermath of 2008 financial crisis and the remedial policies that were adopted to overcome the debilitating effect.

Students of the Society participated in business and economics related competitive events organized by other schools and brought laurel for the school. Some of them are given below:

DISASTER MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Mr Rajesh Shukla, Senior Officer, Delhi Fire Service, delivered a talk to the Middle School students on the 'Fire Safety Precautions' and conducted a mock evacuation drill on 14th December 2017.

Our teachers, Ms Harleen Chadha and Ms Meghna Kapoor, participated in the First International Conference on Mass Disaster and Emergency Management-2018 (a life-saving strategy for public) held on 20th and 21st April 2018 at Dyal Singh College, New Delhi, The conference was organized by the National Task Force for Disaster Management, in association with the Kingsmead School, England, to make India a disaster-free nation and raised awareness about ways to cope with disaster and mitigating risk. The topics like 'Vulnerability and Impact of Natural Disaster on Women', 'Paradigm Shift in Approaching Floods in India', 'Assessment of Ground Water Dynamics' and 'Role of Drones in Disaster Management' were discussed extensively. Demonstration of 'Self-Help Disaster Management Kit' and 'Fire Disaster and Possible Management' were the highlights of the programme.

An inspection of our school for safety and security was conducted by Mr Ashok Kumar, Deputy Director of Education (Co-ordination Branch) on 27th April 2018.

Safety walks are undertaken on monthly basis, weak areas are spotted, corrected and a checklist is drawn.

Safety Committee Meetings are also conducted on monthly basis.

Safety Suggestions Box has been placed in school premises. Suggestion/ complaints, if any, are taken up seriously.

Mock Drill for Fire Evacuation was conducted for the Senior School on 24th July 2018. A fire alarm was raised at 1.45 p.m. and the Senior Block was evacuated.

Ms Deepa Kapoor, Senior Teacher Incharge of the Disaster Management Committee and Mr L.D. Pant from the Administrative Office, attended

a meeting convened on 7th August 2018 by the District Disaster Management Authority, New Delhi District. The points discussed during the meeting were (a) Preparedness of Disaster Management Structural Safety in the School Building (b) Preparation of Schedule to generate awareness about disasters and to impart trainings in schools by DDMA, New Delhi (c) School Safety Preparedness (d) Disaster Management Plan of Schools (e) Cleanliness Drives in Schools.

FASHION TECHNOLOGY CLUB – ‘J’ADORE’

Fashion Technology students of Class S7 were taken to ‘Portfolio’18’ organized by the Pearl Academy of Fashion, Rajouri Garden on 11th May 2018 They attended workshops on 3D Product Making, Slippers Making, Exploring with tools & techniques of Welding etc.

Fashion Technology students of Class S7 attended a Summer Programme from 4th to 8th June 2018 at the Pearl Academy of Fashion where they got exposure to fashion and styling, merchandising, brand management and mass communication.

On 12th July 2018, the Club organized a sensational yet traditional Fashion Show themed - Revival. It was a show of fashion and fusion where the young minds presented their creative novelties designed for the youth. The young designers used fabrics like brocade, net, crepe, silk and embroidery like chikankari, shisha, zardozi etc. to create stunning outfits that were charming to the eyes. FRENCH DEPARTMENT

HISTORY SOCIETY

The Lodhi Garden Heritage Walk, conducted for the History students of Class S7 on 29th July 2018, was a virtual tour de force. Punctuated with antiquity, trivia and local folklore – this engagement with historical mooring, stylistic features of monuments and their vantage verdure setting were rivetingly narrated by their History teacher. The colonial intervention and the subsequent urban morphological status of the Garden was the overarching leitmotif of this walk.

HOME SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

Home Science Department conducted a workshop on 'Authentic Kashmiri Cuisine' for the students of Class S7 and learnt to cook three Kashmiri vegetarian dishes from Ms Rashmi Magazine.

Our students participated in the Inter-School Cooking Competition organized on 21st August 2018 by Sanskriti School, Chanakya Puri. Out of participants from 22 schools from all over Delhi, Sheen Magazine (S7) and Arnav Tara (S7) won the 3rd Prize in the 'Baking' competition while Bhavya Jhala (S6) and Shyamali Chugh (S6) won the 3rd Prize in the 'No Fire Cooking' event.

INTERACT CLUB



Student-members of the Interact Club participated in the competitive initiative 'Behtar India' launched by the NDTV and DFHL Pramerica Life Insurance, which aimed to mobilize students and corporates to join the nationwide movement which focused on the Health, Hygiene

and Environment. Our students worked for Behtar Swasthya, Behtar Swachchhta and Behtar Vatavaran over a period of six months and successfully raised over Rs.7 lakhs, which made our school secure the 1st Position. 'dia' Campaign took place on 5th December 2017 at Hotel Hyatt Regency, New Delhi. Our students, Aditya Dubey and Aradhya Munjal, were placed on the 2nd and 8th Position respectively on the National Students' Leader Board. Our School also received two prizes –the 'Harit Diwali Regional Award (North)' and the 'National Champion School Award'.

During the 12th International Community Development and Leadership Summit (CDLS-2017), the Community Service Day was observed on 4th December 2017. The international delegates, along with the students of the Interact Club of our school, visited various NGOs such as Ozanam, a home for senior citizens, Blind Relief Association, Delhi, 'Palna', a home for the abandoned, relinquished & destitute children, the 'Delhi Cheshire Home', a home for the disabled. The delegates and our students interacted, played games, sang songs, distributed small gifts to the residents and spread happiness. They were also sensitized towards the difficulties faced by these inhabitants and care/compassion they deserve from the society.

Student members of the Interact Club assisted the Hargopal Sports, Cultural & Social Welfare Society in organizing their On-the-Spot Painting Competition and Woollens Distribution Drive for the students of the government and government aided schools on 21st and 22nd December 2017 respectively.

Six student-members of the Interact Club, Diya Goel, Vinayak Bansal, Vishesh Aggarwal, Armaan Aggarwal, Kamyra Jain and Harsifat Kaur, visited the Project 'Life' at the Life Centre and the Greenfield Centre in Rajkot on 18th and 19th December 2017. At the Life Centre, they learnt how the blood is collected, processed and sent to the needy patients, using the most advanced technologies/processes, for transfusing the blood & its components for saving human life. At the Greenfield Centre, they acquired knowledge about 60 varieties of indigenous plants/trees are nurtured and raised to about 6-8 feet until they become self-

sustainable. These plants are then distributed for re-plantation.

The team of students, Diya Goel, Vinayak Bansal, Vishesh Aggarwal, Armaan Aggarwal, Kamyia Jain and Harsifat Kaur, participated in the I.P.S.C. Service Project held at the Rajkumar College, Rajkot from 19th to 23rd December 2017. These students rendered their services to a school in Khakhana village, which was adopted by the Rajkumar College, Rajkot. Our students worked tirelessly passing heavy containers of chunks of coal to each other in a chain and helped in construction of a pathway connected the school gate to the main road. Similarly, they helped build a sitting area for the students of that school by doing physical service. Our students extended their help to paint the walls of the classrooms of that school, together with the students of the village's school. These students of our school used every opportunity to educate the children about the importance of health, hygiene, education and environment. As a part of this service project, a street play was presented by our students to make those villagers aware of the importance of cleanliness, girl education & awareness against domestic violence. Through the IPSC Service Project, our students understood that life is not easy for everyone and learnt the true meaning of service before self.

Four student-members of the Interact Club, Suhani Jain, Kavya Gupta, Tanya Aggarwal and Radhika Singh, participated in the interactive session, team building session and Badminton Tournament held at Manav Rachna Vidyantariksha, Faridabad on 22nd and 23rd December 2017, as a part of their Annual Rotary Youth Leadership Awards.

The members of the Interact Club participated in the 'Walk for Life' at the Rajpath organized by the CanSupport (an NGO) on 4th February 2018, to support the cancer fighters, admire the survivors and honour the departed with pride in their hearts.

The Second Season of the 'DHFL Pramerica Behtar India Campaign' was launched on 10th April 2018 at Taj Lands End, Mumbai with Republic TV as the media partner. The Teacher In-charge of Interact Club together with students attended the function. Aditya Dubey was declared the 2nd National Position Holder.

The Pramerica Spirit of Community Awards is an annual nationwide search to identify and recognize school students who have made a positive difference in their communities through volunteer community service and is open to students from Class 6 to 12. Sai Arjun Shroff (S6) won the 1st Prize and received a Gold Medal for his outstanding project on 'Nature for Health'. He received a Certificate of Excellence, a Gold Medallion, Cash Prize of Rs. 50,000/- and an all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C. in May 2018 for several days of recognition events. The Interact Club carried out a Plantation Drive at the Science Park area of our school on 30th July 2018. Around 200 saplings of Acalypha (medicinal plant) were planted.

KIDS FOR TIGERS CLUB

Anushka Naithani and Samaara Wig, escorted by the Teacher In-charge of the Club, visited the Aravalli Biodiversity Park on 3rd March 2018 as a part of the Club's nature trail activity. They saw a movie about the wildlife in forest. They also learnt about the properties of various plants & trees and how they benefit human life.

To celebrate Earth Day in school, on 20th April 2018, the KFT Club uploaded some power point presentations and videos on the Educomp Smartclass and showed them to the students of Class S4 & S5. Students were encouraged to write articles and design posters on the subject to create awareness about the damage being done to environment by using plastic.

A group of 18 students with their teacher in-charge visited the 'Gaj Mahotsav' held at the Indira Gandhi National Centre for Arts on 12th August 2018. They participated in the panel discussions, workshops. Ms Diya Mirza, a famous actress and an environmentalist, interacted with students and motivated them to conserve wildlife.

LEGAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT

For practical exposure of the students, the Legal Studies department arranged the below mentioned interactive sessions and field visits:

A group of 20 Legal Studies students of Class S6 attended a programme on 'Sexual Violence Module' organized by the Delhi State Legal Services Authority at the Delhi High Court on 27th December 2017. It was a feedback session of the presentation given by the Delhi State Legal Service Authority in our school on 30th November 2017. Students wished to have the Youth Parliament, Youth Ambassadors and Gender Neutrality of the IPC. They also debated on many existing problems like fear of reporting offences and struggling with social acceptance. The psychology of juveniles was mused upon and attempts were made by the experts to explain it.

A group of 40 Legal Studies students of Class S7 visited the Patiala House Court on 6th April 2018. Students interacted/raised questions with the officers of the Delhi Legal Aid Authority and the District & Sessions Judge, New Delhi District and witnessed proceedings of the Civil Court and the Family Court.

On 24th April 2018, 80 Legal Studies students of Classes S6 and S7 were taken to the Police Station at Barakhamba Road, New Delhi. They were briefed about the Investigating Kit that the Investigating Officer carries to the crime scenes. They visited the counselling rooms for women and juveniles, the Maalkhana and the lockup area.

On 25th April 2018, these students visited the L.N.J.P. Hospital. The officials of the Delhi State Legal Aid Services Authority and the hospital staff briefed them about the medico-legal cases. Students were also taken to the 'One-stop Centre' which provides medical, psychological

and legal assistance to victims of abuse.

Legal Studies students of Classes S6 & S7 visited the Karkardooma Court on 5th May 2018 and witnessed proceedings in the Family Court and observed how it is different from adversarial system of proceedings that take place in the Civil and Criminal Courts. They also visited the Special Courts designed for conducting the trials under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 (POCSO).

On 19th May 2018, 3 students of Class S7 - Vedang Khera, Kaartikay Agarwal and Pranjal Dangwal participated in a conference held by Delhi State Legal Service Authority at the Delhi High Court, which aimed to take opinion of the students of 11 schools of different districts in Delhi. The students toured the Delhi High Court, Mediation Centre, Arbitration Centre and the Chief's Court.

Kaartikay Agarwal and Pranjal Dangwal of S7 undertook an internship with the Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLISA), a subsidiary body of the Delhi High Court devoted to providing free legal services to the mass. Working with High Court judges, the two engaged with children all around the state to educate them about their rights: what they are and how to avail them. Kaartikay and Pranjal worked as student representatives from February to October 2018 to provide a much needed opinion about the awareness programs initiated by the DSLISA. One of the awareness campaigns they worked on was the Sexual Abuse Awareness program aimed at teaching children what sexual abuse, harassment and assault is, what to do if one is a victim, and what inappropriate sexual behavior constitutes of. At the end of the internship, Pranjal and Kaartikay received certificates from the Delhi High Court in lieu of their contributions to the project.

'MODEL UNITED NATIONS' SOCIETY

MUN Society Training Programme - On 4th and 5th April 2018, MUN Society held a Group Discussion and Personal Interview for selection of students and on 13th and 14th April 2018 held a Comprehensive Training Session for the recruits.

To provide exposure of real world negotiations to our MUN Society student-members, a talk by Ambassador Anil Wadhwa, IFS Officer, was arranged on 9th May 2018. Over 190 students of Classes from S4 to S7 attended the programme.

An Intra MUN-2018 was conducted for the student-members of the Society on 18th, 19th and 21st May 2018. 89 students of Class S4 participated in the General Assembly, Plenary Session, 39 students of Class S5 deliberated during the Human Rights Commission Session. Security Council Session witnessed participation of 23 students of Class S6.

Our students participate in the Model United Nations Conferences (MUNs) organized by several schools/institutions within and outside Delhi. Their performances have been bringing laurels to school and the recent winnings are reported below:

NATURE CLUB



Dr Bharat Gopal, Director, National Chest Centre and a Senior Consultant at the Maharaja Agrasen Hospital, delivered a talk on 12th October 2017 to our students to educate them about the visible and invisible changes in the environment and its reasons, consequences and the ways to protect and overcome it. The teachers and students placed 'oxygen bomb plants' like Ficus, Aloe Vera, Spider Plant, Snake Plant, Money Plant, which absorb methane & carbon dioxide from the air and release oxygen, in the rooms around the campus.

Students of Nature Club made around 50 Bird Feeders by decorating the used plastic bottles, tetra packs, spoons. Later, they fixed these Bird Feeders on the trees around the Science Park area.

On 20th November 2017, five students of Class S3 attended a 'Go Green' Workshop on 'Green Career Opportunities Programme' at WWF Office, New Delhi. The children were informed about the 'Carbon-Footprint Reduction' and participated in various competitions and brought home various awards.

During the Tree Plantation Drive, at the 12th Community Development & Leadership Summit-2017, "Entrée-Ecofriendly Pens" were distributed. These seed pens have Agastya tree seeds, which is an ornamental tree, also known as the Humming Bird tree.

83 students from Classes S1, S2 and S3 participated in an event organised by the Lung Care Foundation on Saturday 23rd December 2017 to create awareness about the ill effects of pollution on lung health. This was the "World's Largest Air Pollution Awareness Programme" where more than five thousand school students from Delhi came together to create a Guinness World Record of creating largest human image of an organ (lung). Modern School was a proud participant and took part in creating history.

Our students Ameesha Mukhija, Kunal Saluja and Armaan Aggarwal, accompanied by Ms Richa Bhatia, attended the a workshop on 'Water Bodies of Delhi and its Conversation', organized by the Department of Environment of the Delhi Government, as a part of their World Wetland Day celebrations on 2nd February 2018. The experts enlightened the students about the importance of wetlands and water resources. The students took a pledge to conserve water resources for a sustainable future.

As the modern realm's complexities compelled the 3Rs to be metamorphosed into 4R's (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Replenish), the Nature Club organized a Tree Plantation activity on 9th May 2018. The Guests of Honour were Mr Matt Harasymezuk, Astronaut Trainer, Aerospace Engineer and Researcher at the European Space Agency

(ESA) and Dr Agata Kolodziejczyk, Advance Concept Team Head of ESA. Saplings of Mango, Bottle Palm, Papaya and Tulsi were planted.

On 5th June 2018, World Environment Day was celebrated with renewed enthusiasm and fervour. The Club members set the pace for water conservation activities by experimenting with an innovative eco-friendly and cost effective approach. Ficus saplings were planted and at a hand-span distance interned earthen pots into cavities made in the soil and filled the clay pots with water. Due to diffusion, the water is taken up by the roots and keeps the surroundings cool.

A team of 3 teachers and four students visited an exhibition at the India Gate lawns organized by the Government of India on the theme 'Beat Plastic Pollution'. Our students saw innovations like straws made of bamboo, vertical farming on coir mats, plastic vending machines which recycle plastic and exchange plastic for coupon of famous eating joints in Delhi.

Nature Club again organized a Tree Plantation activity to spread awareness about the importance of tree as a part of the 'Van Mahotsav Festival' which was being celebrated across the country from 1st to 7th July 2018.

On 20th August 2018, 2 students of Class S4, Akshara Thakur and Siddhant Ahuja attended workshop of the launch of B.E.S.T. (Breathe Easy and Stay Tough) Club organized by the Lung Care Foundation. B.E.S.T. takes action and spreads awareness on how these initiatives are imperative in these times of declining air quality and deteriorating environmental conditions and, how youth can play an important role in combating them.

Nature Club, in association with Indraprastha Gas Limited, held a Quiz Contest for the students of Classes S1 to S3 and an 'On-the-Spot Power Point Presentation' competition for the students of Classes S1 to S5 on 4th October 2018. SCIENCE CLUB



'SPUNK-2017', a Quiz competition for the students of Class S3 was organized by the Chemistry wing of the Science Club of our school in the month of November and December 2017. The competition took place in four phases viz. Preliminary, Visual, Rapid Fire and Interactive Round. Farhan B. Ahmed secured the 1st Rank while the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Ranks were grabbed by Shaurya Kumar, Ojas Garg and Akshara Thakur respectively.

The Chemistry wing of our Science Club put up an Exhibition on 10th February 2018. Most of the experiments and models, made by the students of Classes from S1 to S4 and S6, used natural compounds that aimed at introducing greener alternatives for a healthy and sustainable future. These interesting experiments and models included (a) Neutralization reaction on flowers dipped in turmeric solution (b) Sound wave fire extinguisher extinguished candle flame (c) Bio-plastic made by students using glycerin, cornstarch and vinegar (d) Degradation of Styrofoam using acetone and limonene extracted from citrus fruits (e) Electricity generated from seawater by the process of electrolysis using zinc and copper electrodes (f) Obtaining clean water using activated carbon, gram flour, neem, tulsi, silt, clay and gravel in a filtration plant (g) Cost effective way to clean up oil spill using wood sorbent (h) Hydraulic lift and proclaimer (i) Dyes like Prussian blue and chrome yellow prepared by using simple chemical reactions. Iodine clock using starch, iodine and distilled water (j) Molecular gastronomy using Sodium alginate & Calcium lactate gluconate by Spherification technique (k) Its DNA extraction using strawberries (l) Making artificial rayon using basic copper carbonate, cotton and ammonium hydroxide (m) Chromatography experiments using chalk (n) Illustrating crystal growth by electrolyzing tin chloride (o) Making plasma to travel to make CFL glow (p) Solar powered air purifier (q) Auto charging shoe (r) Road electricity generator. Display Boards on the learning outcomes, showcasing vision of teachers and output from the students were displayed. Fun learning through comic strips, made by students of Classes S 1 and S 2, was a centre of attraction.

Science stream students Saksham Mittal, Yash Aggarwal and Yash Garg, then in Class S6, attended the workshop titled 'From Fear to Fascination' organized by Bhartiya Vidya Bhawan Mehta Vidyalaya, New Delhi, on 9th December 2017. The workshop included experiments on the Physics related topics viz. Measurement of PI, Frequency of Spring, Archimede's Principle and Polarization.

Five students together with the teacher in-charge attended a workshop on 'Nanotechnology' and participated in a quiz organized by Amity School, Noida on 12th December 2017.

Three students of our School Ameesha Mukhija (S6 A), Saushtav Roy (S6 A) and Samraj Chaudhary (S5 F) participated in the N.D.M.C. Annual Science Fair on the theme 'Innovation for Sustainable Development' held at N.P. Co-ed Senior Secondary School, Lodhi Road from 20th to 22nd December 2017. (i) Saushtav Roy and Samraj Chaudhary together made a 'Solar-Powered Air Purifier' consisting of a solar panel that converts solar energy into electrical energy (ii) Ameesha Mukhija and Saushtav Roy jointly made use of piezoelectric material and converted mechanical stress into electrical energy to make a 'Road Electricity Generator' (iii) Ameesha Mukhija and Samraj Chaudhary as a team made an 'Auto Charging Shoe' that was based on converting mechanical stress during walking to electrical energy using piezoelectric material. Our 'Solar-Powered Air Purifier' received recognition in their Valedictory Ceremony.

A few students of Class S6 attended the Inaugural Ceremony of the C.B.S.E. Regional Level Science Exhibition on the theme 'Sustainable Development' hosted by Evergreen Public School, Vasundhra Enclave on 10th January 2018. Our students took keen interest in witnessing the 163 exhibits displayed there, particularly (i) A fire extinguisher that uses sound waves to extinguish fire by cutting the supply of oxygen to the burning material (ii) Use of Jatropha Curcas seeds to produce biodiesel for use in diesel engines and to meet the diesel fuel requirement of the remote rural and forest communities.

Dhruv Tantia (S5) and Sarvesh Tandon (S5) secured the 12th and the 17th ranks respectively out of 20,000 students in the Science Open Merit Test conducted by the Delhi State Science Teachers' Forum on 11th February 2018. They received the Certificates of Merit and Medals, for being within top 100 rank holders, during an award function on 30th July 2018. Abhinav Agarwal (S7), who secured the 3rd rank in the same examination last year, was awarded with a cash prize of Rs. 10,000/- this year again, as the continuing scholarship for pursuing Science in Classes 11 & 12.

On 20th February 2018, 40 students of Class 10 attended a session held in school by SRJNA. The session focused on teaching the basic concepts of Light: Reflection and Refraction and Electricity and Magnetism through teaching aids and analogies.

A group of 101 students from Classes S5 and S6 visited the Medical Expo-Catalyst organized by the students' union of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) on 27th April 2018, with the aim of generating interest towards the medical profession amongst students. The exhibition gave them the opportunity to see real organs of the human body. It also focused on health issues such as lifestyle disorders, cancer and substance abuse. Life saving technique, Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation, was demonstrated.

A group of 8 students from Class S4 and S6 attended a seminar on Cosmological Origins on 19th July 2018 in the Sky Theatre at the Nehru Planetarium. Students were educated about the Big Bang Theory and the discovery of Hydrogen, Uranium and the Mendeleev's Periodic Table.

A Science Exhibition was organized in the Junior Biology Laboratory on 25th August 2018. 55 students from Classes S1 to S3 displayed their Science related models on various concepts like – Pneumatic Pumps, Robotic Arm, Green Energy Park, Milk Recycling, E-Waste Management etc.

Siddharth stood 28th in Arts, bagging 12 medals and achieved an overall rank of 87. Harsh Beri was the recipient of a total of 7 medals along with a debating rank of 299.

Arahana Yadav (S7) attended a course on 'Women and Children Protection' from 9th to 20th April 2018 conducted by United Nations Women. Later she participated in a course on 'Exercise Blue Helmets' held by Centre of United Nations Peace Keeping, New Delhi.

A team of our Class S3 students, Akshat Khurana, Aanya Mehra and Jyotirmay Sharma, qualified to participate in the Global Round World Scholars' Cup 2018 by winning the 4th Position in the Champion Bowl Trophy at the Regional Round of the held at the Suncity School, Gurgaon on 28th & 29th April 2018. Jyotirmay Sharma won a Silver Medal individually for the Debating event and another Medal for the overall best performance in the school team.

Based on her performance in a test conducted by the Times NIE in April 2018, Diya Sabharwal (S5) was selected for the Times NIE Summer Training Programme 2018-2019. Diya attended their training programme from 21st to 29th May 2018 and availed the opportunity of working with the national editorial team of the Times of India-Student Edition and gained hands on experience in journalism, understanding the finer details of writing and presentation of a story. She also visited their Printing Press at Sahibabad and was presented a Letter of Recommendation from the Editor.

Arahana Yadav(S7) attended the 'United Nations Training of Trainers' course from 18th to 22nd June 2018 on 'Responsibility to Protect: Their Role in Mass Atrocities'. The training course was conducted by three trainers from United Nations Security Council, New York, USA. Arahana went as a UN Volunteer to study, research, discuss and present a paper on the mass atrocity crimes around the world. She made a presentation and a case study on Rwanda Crisis with another volunteer from Sri Lanka, which earned them the tag of 'Future Commanders of MOB' on their perception of handling the crisis.

Abhinav Agarwal (S7) attended the Yale Young Global Scholars Programme 2018 on scholarship for 'Applied Science and Engineering' held at the Yale University, U.S.A. from 17th to 30th June 2018.

In June 2018, Harsh Gupta (S7) launched a Smartphone App 'Spined', an Android application that can help upper back illness due to excess usage of smartphone. This App can track and control their condition since it issues warnings to users coaxing them to switch over to a back-healthy posture. His research paper titled 'Smartphone Based Cervical Spine Prevention' was published in the February 2018 edition of the International Journal of Software Engineering and Applications (JSEA). He has also filed for an Indian Patent for the same. This Android App was #1 Trending in Health and Fitness on Google Play Store for 2 days after the release.

Harsh Gupta (S7) has published another research paper to automatically detect Squint, an eye disorder. He was invited to give an oral presentation for his paper 'Heterotropia Diagnosis using Machine Learning and Computer Vision' at IEEE International Conference on Contemporary Computing and Informations 2018 where he explained how he used digital image processing and neural networks to diagnose the disease. He was given an international Digital Object Identifier (DOI) for the IEEE Xplore Paper. Detection of heterotropia using smartphone may prove to be a key way to prevent more serious eye disorders. His achievement placed him amongst the brightest minds in Student academia in India and Modern as a premier institution guided towards innovations.

Students from Class S2 – Aarav Bajaj, Arsh Jain and Vaanya Jain attended a 2-day FILMIT Workshop conducted by the Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH) on 27th July 2018. Mr Faisal Alkazi, amongst many famous speakers conducted a session, that provided a rewarding insight into Film Making and Editing.

A team of 4 students of Class S7, Pradyuman Raj Mehta (Photography), Chaitanya Jain (Theatre), Riya Jindal (Fine Arts) and Prakriti Dahiya (Dance), participated in the 'Young Leaders' Conclave 6.0' (a non-competitive event) conducted by Modern School, Vasant Vihar from 10th to 14th August 2018.

Vikram Goyal of Class S3 won the 2nd Prize in the Contest No.549 of the Pace Challenge Quiz published daily by the Hindustan Times.
